How do I register to vote?

How do I register?	Deadline	*Same day registration is ONLY available in the following counties:	
Mailing a registration form (<u>link</u>)	Postmarked by October 11		
Online at voter.utah.gov	November 1	- Cache - Davis - Kane	- Salt Lake - San Juan - Sanpete - Weber
In person at county clerk's office	November 1	- Millard	
At the polls on election day*	November 8*		

Q: How do I know if I'm registered to vote?

If you are not sure whether you are register to vote, contact your county clerk or the Lieutenant Governor's office (1-800-995-VOTE).

Q: I changed my address or name. Do I need to update my voter registration?

Yes! If you have a new address or name, you will need to submit a new registration form.

What are the deadlines for mail ballots?

Ballots are mailed to voters	October 11 – October 18
Last day to request a mail ballot by mailing an application (link)**	Received by November 3
Last day to request a mail ballot online at voter.utah.gov**	November 3
Postmark your ballot	November 7

^{**}Voters in all vote by mail counties do not need to request a mail ballot.



How can I vote?

You may have a variety of options to vote depending on the county in which you live. To see your county's specific voting information, take a look at the table on the next page.

• Vote by mail (postmark your ballot by November 7th)

- 21 counties will be conducting their elections entirely by mail which means your ballot will be automatically delivered to you.
- o If you live in a county that is not voting by mail, you can request a mail ballot by submitting an application (link) to your county clerk.

Vote early in person (October 25th - November 4th)

 11 counties are offering in person early voting. Visit <u>vote.utah.gov</u> to find early voting locations and times in your county.

• Vote on Election Day (November 8th)

Many counties are providing polling places on Election Day, and many voters in vote by mail
counties can vote at their county clerk's office. Enter your address at <u>vote.utah.gov</u> to locate the
nearest polling location near you.
